- The plan will remove 60% of the street's parking.
- 40% of the population is over 65. Eliminating street parking is problematic for older residents who have more mobility issues. Not adequate parking for visitor, caregivers. Having to carry groceries or other packages when parking is eliminated.
- Other nearby roads that have less traffic including the Ohlone Greenway
- Not safe for bicyclists. Driveways are considered intersections. Navigating 80 intersections over a 1 mile stretch of Richmond St.



The El Cerrito Democratic Club is honored to host an evening with Supervisor John Gioia Topic – How the Threatened Federal Cuts Impact Vital Local Services John Gioia has been a County Supervisor since 1999 and served on the EBMUD Board from 1989 to 1998.

He has led regional initiatives to improve air quality, address climate change, and make SF Bay healthier and more accessible. He served on the California Air Resources Board for 7 years and has been on the Bay Area Air District Board since 2006.

John holds a leadership position with the California State Association of Counties, serves on the SF Bay Conservation and Development Commission, and is Chair of both the East Bay Wildfire Coalition of Governments and the SF Bay Restoration Authority.

He grew up in Richmond, graduated from El Cerrito High School and UC Berkeley with a B.A. and a law degree, and practiced law until elected to the Board of Supervisors.

His public service was inspired by his father, who was a civics teacher at Kennedy High School in Richmond. John helped found the RYSE Youth Center in Richmond and is working with non-profit Urban Tilth to develop a community farm in North Richmond.
