Voting for the recall election ends Tuesday September 14th. By now you have received your ballot. Hopefully you have already returned it. Please resist the urge to turn over the ballot and mark the side with many, many names.



Please vote "No" and return your ballot early.

The California State Democratic Party delivered all of five yard signs. ECDC's Executive Board decided to invest \$500 towards printing additional signs. With many members also donating to this printing effort, we were able to get an additional 250 yard signs. Janet Abelson is coordinating the distribution. We also received about 1,000 door hangers. These are for anyone to walk their neighborhood and deliver. Ideally, you would use the handheld software available through the Democratic Party of Contra Costa County. They are using PDI's online application to identify critical households. 8. Appeal to Support DA Diana Becton – June 7, 2022 Election

Our District Attorney Diana Becton has been working hard to bring change to the DA's office; and it has not been an easy road. With attacks from inside-the-house to being labeled as the Contra Costa County Republican Party's "Number One" target in 2022, DA Becton can use all of our support – including that of the El Cerrito Democratic Club.

Below are a few of District Attorney Diana Becton's accomplishments over the last three years:

2018

- Implemented a partnership with The Vera Institute of Justice (VERA). The partnership allows the DA's office to take a critical look at its own decision-making by joining actions aimed at ending racial and implicit bias in the justice system. This program focuses on using data to inform and implement progressive policies and decision making within the DA office.
- Initiated a new policy for the DA Office's investigations into fatal incidents involving
 members of law enforcement. At the conclusion of the criminal investigation, DA Becton will
 publicly release a report in all law enforcement involved fatal incidents, even if no charges
 are filed against an officer. The reports are posted on the DA Office's website, marking the
 first time reports are consistently released to the public even in the absence of charges.

2019

- Awarded \$1 million to establish a county-wide juvenile diversion pre-filing program.
 This diversion program is Contra Costa's first county-wide juvenile diversion program.
 DA Becton partnered with RYSE Youth Center and Impact Justice to initiate a restorative justice program that redirects youth from the juvenile criminal justice system, reduces the pipeline into the criminal justice system, lowers recidivism, and reduces disparities in the criminal justice system.
- Joined Code For America's initiative to dismiss thousands of old marijuana convictions. Roughly 2400 individuals received relief and longer have felony and/or misdemeanor marijuana convictions on their record.

2020

- Formed a Reimagine Youth Justice Task Force that is studying and making recommendations on the most effective ways to invest in youth through restorative, community-based solutions instead of youth prisons which very often worsened outcomes for children and their families.
- Created a new process to improve DA Office investigations into officer-involved shootings.
- Held the first-ever training for the Investigative Unit on officer-involved shootings.
