3. Minutes from the June 27th ECDC General Membership Meeting

El Cerrito Democratic Club
General Membership Meeting Minutes
June 27, 2023
(via Zoom Only this Month)

President Brown Called the Meeting to Order at 6:30 p.m.

Approve Minutes from the May 2023 General Membership Meeting (Action Item) The minutes were approved.

Officer Reports: Treasurer, Membership, Programs, Publications, Media, Records, President Report

- Membership 155 members in good standing.
- Programs Working on speakers for the July "Housing" presentation.
- President Thoughts of adding a social ½ hour prior to the meeting to keep and grow relationships. Will take this to the Eboard and will come back to the general membership in July.

Democratic Party of Contra Costa County (DPCCC) Report (Brown)

- Presentation by Ken Carlson, New Board Supervisors member (Area 4). Willing to engage
 in discussion on the formation of an oversight commission over sheriff operations.
 Interested in the type of oversight body that can provide guidance.
- **Bylaw Change** Whenever a member arrives, they will be eligible to vote on an action item. It used to be that you needed to be there from when quorum was established to vote. The change was initiated to refrain from silencing anyone's voice. It is expected that members will show up on time, however.
- District 1 Update (Nye)
 - Clubs are doing outreach ECDC will be at El Cerrito's July 4th celebration. West County Dems have been at Cinco De Mayo, Richmond Pride, Juneteenth. Visibility interests new members.
 - Mister Phillips gave his resignation to District 1. There will be an election to take over the remaining time on the seat. Any voters/candidates for the seat needs to be a paid member of District 1. The election is only to fill the remaining time in the seat. Then, the person will need to run again in a public election. NOTE: Getting publicly elected does not automatically make you a delegate to the state party.

Program: "The American Way: Gun Violence in America." Vanessa Smart, Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America

• Moms Demand Action was started by Shannon Watts after Sandy Hook. There is now a chapter in every state.

- Grassroots movement fighting for public safety measures that can protect people from gun violence in America.
- What do they do:
 - Support Gun Laws, Support Local Partners and Strategies, Elect Gun Sense Candidates, Secure Gun Storage, Train and Support Volunteers, Create Awareness
- Firearms are the #1 leading cause of death for American children and teens beating out motor vehicle accidents, poisoning, cancer and suffocation
- Gun violence is preventable. Work in communities to encourage a culture of responsible gun ownership. Pass stronger gun laws and close loopholes.

- Suicide Prevention Hotline Call 988 across the country. Very new... not even a year old.


Legislation at the CA State Level

- AB 28 (Gabriel) Modest excise tax on guns and ammunition will fund programs to prevent gun violence.
- SB 2 (Portantino) Strengthening laws around those that carry firearms in public.

At the National Level

Working to reinstate the ban on the sale of assault weapons.

Lisa is a Senior Affordable Housing Finance Consultant expertise in the field of nonprofit, community-based affordable housing finance and development. In 2020, Lisa was elected to the El Cerrito City Council and,

at Community Economics, a firm that provides technical since 2022, has served as Mayor.

Lisa joined Community Economics in 2018, bringing together her experience and expertise from work across the public, nonprofit and for profit affordable housing development sectors, and through the lifecycle of development from feasibility to refinance and recapitalization. With over 25 years of housing development experience, Lisa brings her passion and expertise to improving the lives of low income people.

Prior to Community Economics, she served as a program director at the San Francisco Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development where she was primarily responsible for the infrastructure and real estate aspects of the nation's first large-scale public housing transformation and reparations effort. During her tenure, 643 units were completed or started construction, and entitlements and development agreements approved for 3,300 units.

Before her transition to the public sector, Lisa was an affordable housing developer and advocate in the nonprofit sector. In her previous position as Housing Development Director at Resources for Community Development, she was responsible for the development of over 1100 units serving over 3,000 low income adults and children, many with special needs.

In addition to her work experience, she has served in volunteer positions ranging from the Contra Costa County Affordable Housing Finance Committee, and the EBHO Board of Directors, to the El Cerrito Planning Commission and the Oversight Board of the San Francisco Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure. She earned her master's degree in City and Regional Planning at UC Berkeley.

5. 2023 Pre-Endorsement Conference Delegates Election

El Cerrito Democratic Club will participate in the California Democratic Party's (CADEM)
Pre-Endorsement Conference on October 21-22. Pre-Endorsement Conference allows CADEM
Regions to participate in endorsement recommendations for US House (CD), State Senate
(SD), and State Assembly (AD) elections. ECDC participation ensures our voices are heard
during the endorsement process for candidates.

Although CADEM still has to finalize the numbers, ECDC is on track to be awarded five delegates with the potential of 7 if our roster holds stable after member verification. ECDC will elect five delegates with two alternates. If ECDC is awarded six delegates, the alternate with the highest vote will become a voting delegate. If ECDC is awarded seven delegates, then both alternates will become voting delegates for Pre-Endorsement.

The election for Pre-Endorsement will be held via the poll function for members who will participate electronically on Zoom. Paper ballots will be provided for members who participate in person. The vote total from the paper ballots and electronic polling will be combined to determine the candidates with the highest vote and our alternates.
