3. Minutes from the May 23rd ECDC General Membership Meeting

El Cerrito Democratic Club General Membership Meeting Minutes May 23, 2023 Via Zoom and In-Person at Hana Gardens Senior Center

President Brown called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Approval Minutes from the April 2023 Meeting On the motion of Merrill and Second of Kronenberg, the minutes are unanimously approved with no nays nor abstentions.

Nominations: Preconference Delegates

Not finalized, but possible for ECDC to get seven delegates. Historically the club has been awarded five or six. President Brown would like nominations for up to seven people in the event that seven are awarded. Pre-conference is a way to have the club's voice heard for endorsement for congressional members, state assembly and senate members. Pre-conference is held in the Bay Area. Not sure if there is proxy voting. The dates are believed to be October 21 and 22. The June meeting will select the nominees.

Program: "Where Are We Going?" - Transportation after COVID BART Director Rebecca Saltzman, District 3

Transit is in crisis because of the Pandemic. Ridership has climbed back to 42% of pre-pandemic levels. Downtown San Francisco office occupancy mirrors BART ridership. San Francisco has some of the lowest return-to-office rates of any major metropolitan area. Huge deficit for BART. -\$350 million less since 2019. Three separate federal packages passed have helped to this point. However BART is different because it has very high fixed costs compared to other transit systems. 29% of costs are fixed. 35% semi-variable. Can't achieve the same savings by cutting service. In March 2025, federal funds will expire. The shortfall will rise to \$340 million. It is a big problem.

There is no other funding. Possibilities to solve fiscal issues could be: One train an hour. Open stations later and close earlier.Shutting stations. End weekend service. Alter lines. Mass layoffs. Fewer trains will result in:

Increased road congestion. Impact climate and equity goals.

One BART train moves 1500 people. Approx. five miles of traffic is eliminated with each train. Looking to CA State assistance as all transit in the state is affected.Looking to a regional transportation measure. Still seeking federal assistance but not looking promising with the current divide in Washington.

Plans to Grow Ridership

- Addressing staffing. There were a lot of vacancies caused by hiring freezes and early retirements to get a hold on costs early in the pandemic.
- Working on safety, homelessness, cleanliness, service.
- 20 minutes is the max you will wait for a train.
- Deploying ambassadors and crisis counselors to handle issues. Reassigning police to the inside of the trains.
- Replacing fare gates to limit fare evasion. Will finish up in 2024-2025
- 20% discount for qualifying incomes. Thinking of offering more 50% discounts

Del Norte Bart station remodel. Art, restrooms, well maintained, pidgeon solution, Hawk comes 2-3 days a week.

El Cerrito Plaza station will be a big development.

Measure RR \$3.5B bond measure for reinvestment in infrastructure.

Install the BART Watch app on your phone. You can contact BART Police with issues.

AC Transit Director H. E. Christian ("Chris") Peeples, At-Large

- Mr. Peeples gives a brief history of Bay Area transportation.
- AC Transit's revenue stream is diverse, but still needs federal funds to make up a gap in ridership. All federal funds will expire in FY 24-25
- AC Transit Demographic 65% low-income, 75% of color, 29% limited English proficiency, 27% riding/commuting to work. Riders during pandemic: 40% traveling an essential trip, 15% essential worker, 43% without access to a car.
- Fares are growing slowly, but are only back to 50% pre-pandemic. Many costs are fixed and substantial capital requirements are needed to be 100% zero emission by 2040.
- Proactively looking for funding through a "Financial Cliff Working Group," Careful budget development, managing remaining federal funds, ongoing advocacy to find funding and more.
- Rail gets most funding through fares because it tends to carry higher income people.
- Transbay ridership went down, but most AC Transit ridership is local so they fared better, but the ridership is nowhere what it used to be.

- 2024 elections/propositions, etc. will be housing. Everyone has told the transit agencies to back off for the 2024 election. AC Transit is considering some kind of a regional measure in 2026.
- Bay Area Council/Silicon Valley Leadership Group (Mega chamber of commerce) suggested a minimal sales tax increase (\$.01) and came under heavy criticism.

AC Transit has workforce challenges, but is not alone. There are challenges across the country. These are well compensated, family-supporting union jobs with healthcare. Struggling to fill because they are jobs that require work with the public. Recent hiring fair made conditional offers to 120 people conditional offers. Would like to hire 200.

AC transit has been running zero emission buses for 20 years and is an innovator and leader in this work. Supposed to be a zero emission fleet by 2040. This may be difficult because buses have gone up 40% in price. Parts, labor, manufacturing, chips, etc."Realigning the system" survey to figure out how people are moving and realigning the system/routes to new patterns.

Q&A Session

Comments about recent observed behavior/safety/fare evasion/cleanliness/unhoused on BART Funding measures Thanks for the work. Very challenging right now. Glazer and Borenstein: Why do they hate Bart? Length of trains Belief that state funding is the answer. All are encouraged to call local state and assembly members and the governor about future funding.

Call to Action: City of El Cerrito's "worldOne 4th of July Festival" (Volunteers Needed)

There will be four shifts. President Brown will ask for names to staff those shifts in June.

ECDC participation ensures our voices are heard during the endorsement process for candidates. The exact number will not be determined until July, however, based on our membership numbers, we expect the El Cerrito Democratic Club will be represented by five to seven delegates at the CDP Pre-Endorsement Conference. We originally expected to choose our ECDC delegates in June, however we've postponed the vote until our July 2023 General Membership Membership. The California Democratic Party moved the deadline to submit delegates to September 1st to allow affiliate clubs time to "match" club members in their club registries. "Matching" ensures the club member names submitted match the information found in the Political Data Intelligence ("PDI") voter files and are registered as Democrats.

During the July General Membership Meeting, the ECDC members will be asked vote for a slate of Pre-Endorsement delegates, after which names will be forwarded to the CDP Regional Director.
