Call to Order

President Brown called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Approval of Agenda

On the motion of Ktsanes and the second of Tsutsui, the agenda was approved without any nays but with two abstentions.

Approval of Minutes: August 2023 General Membership Meeting

On the motion of Merrill and the second of Tsutsui, the minutes were approved without any nays but with two abstentions.

Officer Reports:

Treasurer - Reported cash balance at \$9,364.02. All accounts are up to date.

Membership - Currently 161 members. The membership year ends September 30, 2023. Nineteen people have already renewed. President Brown reminds the E-Board to renew.

Programs - The program for October is the Annual Dinner, which is October 14, 2023. Nancy Skinner will be the guest.

Publications - It is \$30 for two members to join the club. There was an error in the newsletter. Will accept \$23 memberships until the next publication.

Media - Moderators on the Facebook page have been updated to current Board members. There was a large amount of SPAM going up. Wysinger will bring suggestions for a Social Media policy to the Board/Membership. There should be better guidelines as to who is a moderator, and better guidelines as to what goes up on the Facebook site.

Records - No Report

Democratic Party of Contra Costa County (DPCCC) Report

Brown:

- Region 3 meeting 10/7 at 10 am. The meeting will be virtual.
- Pre-endorsement conference is 10/22. ECDC delegates are asked to leave 10/21 and 10/22 reserved for the conference. This will be a virtual meeting.
- Report out from DLI Committee polling e board members first.
- Rule Changes code of conduct. Will mirror CADEMS code of conduct.

Additional language for online and hybrid meetings. Club reps have to ID themselves as to what body they are representing.

- The October BBQ has been canceled. All efforts will move to the holiday party in December.
- Candidate Training 101. New candidates and maybe newly elected who want to run a better campaign. Might be a slight cost on the training.
- Candidate forum next month. The focus will be on offices that are State Senate and Assembly and above.

Nye District 1 Update:

- Meeting with Democratic electeds. Other clubs are seeking to follow the ECDC model of nurturing candidates.

A social justice advocate, clean energy and climate change trailblazer and accomplished legislator, Nancy Skinner was first elected to the state Senate in 2016 after



completing three terms in the state Assembly. Senator Skinner currently serves as chair of the Senate's Budget and Fiscal Review Committee and of the California Legislative Women's Caucus.

Skinner has authored groundbreaking laws including SB 206, the Fair Pay to Play Act, making California the first state to give college athletes the right to earn money from their name, image, and likeness; SB 1421, opening up police misconduct records for the first time in 40 years; and SB 1437, overhauling California's unjust felony murder rule. While in the Assembly, she authored AB 153, requiring Amazon and other internet retailers to collect sales tax; AB 1014, the first in the nation gun violence restraining order otherwise known as 'red flag' law; and AB 1930, giving college students access to federal food assistance, which has now been copied by most every state in the country. In 2021, Skinner led the successful campaign to make California the first state in the nation to make free school meals available to all public school children.

Skinner began her public service in 1984 as the first and only student elected to the Berkeley City Council. On the council, Skinner introduced the nation's first Styrofoam ban and

co-founded an international association, ICLEI-Local Governments for Sustainability, which now includes 2,500 local and regional governments in over 125 countries. Skinner's work at ICLEI led to the initiation of the Cities for Climate Protection program, which engaged hundreds of cities worldwide to take action to stop climate change.

Skinner is a past member of the East Bay Regional Park District board, a former small business owner, and an active advocate to increase the number of women in elected office. She served on the Board of the East Bay Women's Political Caucus and launched the Women in Power PAC to support Democratic women running for state office.

Skinner's Senate District includes the cities of Alameda, Albany, Berkeley, El Cerrito, Emeryville, El Sobrante, Hercules, Kensington, Oakland, Piedmont, Pinole, Richmond, Rodeo, San Leandro, and San Pablo. She is a graduate of UC Berkeley, earning both a BS and an MA.

6. Join the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) for the West Contra Costa School District!

The West Contra Costa Unified School District's Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee provides independent oversight of the school district's construction bond program, which is used to rebuild and remodel schools. The Committee actively reviews and reports on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction. The Committee publishes an annual report of its findings.



There are a couple of openings on the committee, but by law, a seat on the committee is reserved for someone who is a

member of a local business organization, and filling this vacancy is the immediate priority for the committee.

The committee meets once a month, and is composed of a diverse group of shareholders - from beginner to extremely experienced. Talents related to construction, audits, accounting, project management, architecture and contracts are great, but are not required. What is required is to be open to learning. This is a great opportunity to meet others in the community and to learn something new.
