# 4. July Program: Discussion of and ECDC Member-Voted Endorsements for Statewide Propositions and Regional/Local Measures on the November 5th Ballot

The El Cerrito Democratic Club hosts election year candidate forums and issues member-voted upon endorsements. Per the ECDC Standing Rules for Endorsements and as previously announced, to vote in the ECDC endorsement process you must be a paid member in good standing 45 days before the endorsement vote.

We will vote on endorsing <u>statewide propositions and regional/local ballot measures</u> at the upcoming Tuesday, July 23rd General Membership Meeting.

• To be eligible to vote on propositions and ballot measure endorsements in July, you must have been a member in good standing with your membership fees paid as of June 8, 2024.

We will vote on endorsing candidates between Saturday, August 17th-Monday, August 19th.

- To be eligible to vote on candidate endorsements in August, you must be a member in good standing as of July 5, 2024.

| State | 5 | Lower Supermajority Requirement to 55% for Local Bond Measures to Fund Housing and Public Infrastructure Amendment | Constitutional amendment lowering the supermajority vote requirement from two-thirds (66.67%) vote to 55% for local jurisdictions to issue bonds for affordable housing and public infrastructure projects.  |
| State | 6 | Remove Involuntary Servitude as Punishment for Crime Amendment   | Constitutional amendment repealing language prohibiting involuntary servitude except to punish crime and replace it with language prohibiting slavery and involuntary servitude absolutely.  Prohibits the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation from disciplining any incarcerated person for refusing a work assignment but authorizes the department to award credits to incarcerated persons who voluntarily participate in work assignments. |

For employers with 26 or more workers, the minimum wage would reach \$18 on January 1, 2025. For employers with 25 or less workers, the minimum wage would reach \$18 on January 1, 2026. | State | 34 | Require Certain Participants in Medi-Cal Rx Program to Spend 98% of Revenues on Patient Care | Requires health care providers that spent over \$100 million in any 10-year period on anything other than direct patient care and operated multifamily housing with over 500 high-severity health and safety violations to spend 98% of revenues from the federal discount prescription drug program on direct patient care.  Penalizes violators of the initiative with loss of tax-exempt status and licenses to operate health insurance plans, pharmacies, and clinics.  Permanently authorizes the Medi-Cal RX program in state law. |
| State | 35 | Managed Care<br>Organization Tax<br>Authorization  | Makes a current tax on managed health care insurance plans permanent, which is now set to end in 2026.  Money from this tax is used to provide health care services to low-income families, seniors, people with disabilities, and others in the Medi-Cal program.  |

| State                          | 36  | Drug and Theft<br>Crime Penalties<br>and Treatment<br>Mandated<br>Felonies   | Increases penalties for certain drug crimes by increasing sentence lengths and level of crime.  Also adds fentanyl to the list of drugs (currently cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine) that would warrant a felony charge if an individual possessed one of them and a loaded firearm.   |  |
