Reasons for the Recall (In Becton's Opinion)

- Follow other cities that have recalled DAs. There is a false narrative that certain DAs are not holding people to account and are soft on crime. Contra Costa is one of two counties where violent crime has fallen.
- Murder of Alexis Gabe. Tragically killed in 2022. Proponents of the recall do not feel that everyone that should have been charged in the case were charged. There is not substantial and sufficient evidence to bring forward any more charges in the case.

The recall campaign will need to collect 72,000 signatures by September 25. A recall campaign would cost at least \$8 million.

4. Program: Rosa Menjivar, The Latina Center, "Protecting Immigrants: Know your Rights" Seminar

My name is Rosa Menjivar-Cruz. I am married and have a 16-year-old daughter. I hold a degree in Business Administration from El Salvador and a degree in Theology from the U.S. For the past fourteen years, I have worked at The Latina Center, where I have coordinated various including Breast Cancer Prevention, Home to Home Domestic Violence, and Young Future Leaders for ten years. Currently, I serve as the Manager of the Community Engagement and Advocacy Program, which includes committees: Health, Housing, Education, the Peace Committee (where we collaborate with the police), and the Immigration Committee.

Over the years, we have taken young people and adults to the California Senate at least once or twice yearly to advocate for different bills that benefit our community. I have also led



immigration forums and Know Your Rights talks with the Richmond and San Pablo police, churches, parents, local school youth, and the broader community. This year, I have worked closely with the Richmond and San Pablo police, and I have successfully provided Know Your Rights training to around 1,200 Latino individuals.

Rosa Menjivar- Cruz, estoy Casada y tengo una hija de 16 Anos de edad. Soy Graduada en Administración de Empresas en El Salvador y gradudada en Teología en EE. UU. Tengo catorce años trabajando en la Organización The Latina Center, coordinando diferentes programas como: Breast Cáncer Prevention, Home to Home Domestic Viólence, 10 years with Young Latín Future Leaders, y desde hace dos años estoy como Manganer of Community Engagement and Advocacy Program en el cual tenemos 5 comités: Salud, vivienda, Educación, Comité de Paz donde trabajamos con la policía y El comité de Inmigración.

Durante estos catorce años hemos llevado a jóvenes y adultos al Senado de California por lo menos una o dos veces al año para abogar por diferentes propuestas de ley a beneficio de la comunidad. También he estado encargada de realizar foros de Inmigración y charlas de Know Your Rigths con la Policía de Richmond y San Pablo, Iglesias, padres y jóvenes de las escuelas y comunidad en general. Este ano he trabajado de la mano con la Policía de Richmond y Sa Este ano hemos servido alrededor de 1, 200 personas latinas con los entrenamientos de Know Your Rights.
